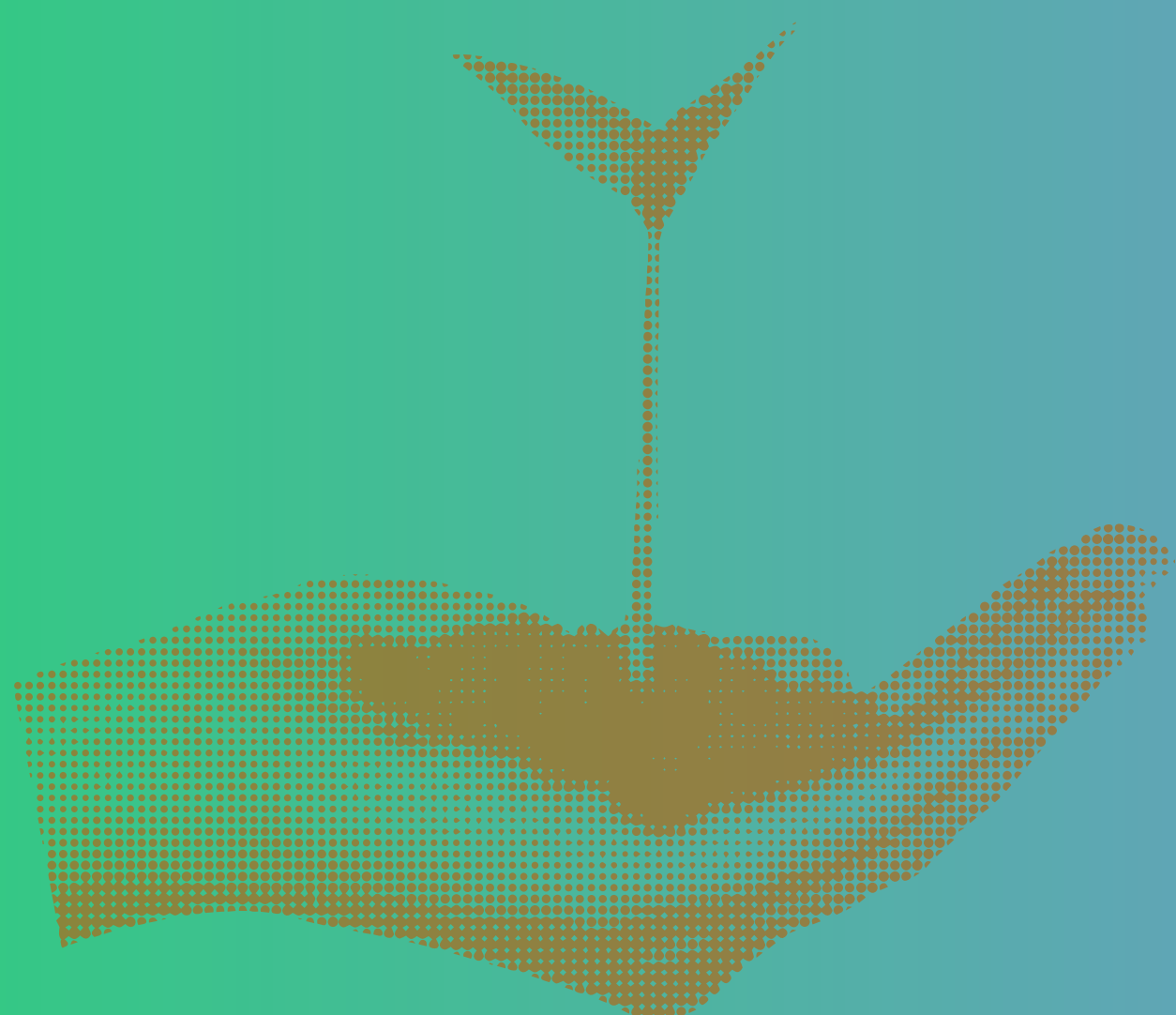

Seeds of Hope: A Feminist Requiem is coming to Glasgow in October, and you are invited to sing in the community chorus, come to a stand-alone singing workshop and/or enjoy the concert.

This secular requiem was written by Penny Stone in memory of her amazing feminist mum, Sue Stone, and brings together the words of women from all over the world, spanning from 575 CE until the present day. The requiem is sung in 18 languages (you won't have to sing all of them!) and combines a variety of community choir, semi-chorus and soloist acapella singing with cello, violin, percussion and French horn. There are also some singing-together choruses for the audience to join in with that will be taught at the beginning of the concert.

There is space in this piece for singing and listening, for sadness and joy, and for connection as well as time spent with our own individual feelings.

There will be a singing workshop on Saturday Sept 19th (you can come to this as a stand-alone workshop if you're not able to come to the concert) and rehearsals on the evening of Friday Oct 2nd and Saturday 3rd. The concert is on Oct 3rd. Penny will teach all of the music by ear, and dots are available for people that find them helpful, as well as audio tracks to sing along with. The music is very accessible, and all are welcome, no previous experience of singing or performance is necessary. This is not a women-only event, all genders are welcome.

Costs are on a sliding scale, and if the lower end is still too much, do drop Penny a line and she is very happy to make further subsidised spaces available if possible.
